

Saskatchewan celebrates Global Biotechnology Week with the Sixth Annual Amazing Biotech Race

Saskatoon, SK: The race is on! The Sixth Annual Amazing Biotech Race starts at 1:15 pm today at Innovation Place.

Saskatchewan Polytechnic BioScience Technology Program students are mixed with high school students from Evan Hardy, Nutana and Bedford Road Collegiates, and divided into teams. Students search for checkpoint companies where they find clues, solve puzzles or answer skill testing questions in order to complete the race.

Following the race, a networking reception will give students the opportunity to chat with representatives from the participating companies and learn more about the Saskatchewan bioscience industry. This gives students the chance to learn what it's like to work in bioscience, as well as how important biotechnology is in our day-to-day lives.
